Day #1



Day #2

Find a spot, somewhere that you can allow the noise of life, work, family and responsibilities to fade away. The instructions are simple: find your spot and just be quiet. Take a journal, a pen, your Bible and just be quiet. Allow the presence of the Lord to speak to your heart.

Below are some questions to get you thinking:

- Think for a moment about the massiveness of what you see around you. Think about the variety, think about the processes and systems that have to occur every second of everyday, since the beginning of time for all of this to have been created and continue working. Photosynthesis, root systems, water erosion, seasonal changes, etc. This didn't just happen, this was **CREATED**. In the same way that He sustains nature, He sustains you and I everyday. How has God sustained you?

- Think for a moment about the animals around you (hopefully nothing big) that are nourished and taken care of, not by human hands but by God Himself. Be reminded of Matthew 6:26, “Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?” (NIV) How is God reminding you that you are valuable to Him?

- **Think for a moment about the freshness of the air. It's crisp & clean. What area of your life is God calling you to freshen & clean up? What area of life has become stagnant?**
